Inclusion criteria

- Published in peer-reviewed journals or by credible organizations (e.g., World Bank, World Health Organization, United Nations)
- Contains original data on unit costs or cost-effectiveness (i.e., economic evaluations, or intervention studies that include an economic assessment)
- Costing methods and data provided in adequate detail
- If applicable (e.g., cost-effectiveness analysis), contains a description of the intervention in the methods or introduction
- Published on or after January 1, 2000

Exclusion criteria

- Not published in English
- Study focused on high-income country, countries, or regions
- Review or systematic review of economic evaluation(s)
- Lacking information on currency or year
- Lacking information on the geographic region, population under consideration, and/or time frame of the study
- Health system (provider) costs not reported (e.g., only payer costs or aggregated costs from a societal perspective reported)
